## **NEW EQUIPMENT & PLAYGROUND REPLACEMENTS**

I had a phone meeting with Grafton Parks and Rec. Director, Megan Phalin on February 11. She wanted to update me on the status of the playground replacements and the new equipment listed in our ten year plan.

First, she wanted to dispel a rumor that vandals damaged 70% of the playground equipment. It has now been determined that the old playground equipment was just worn out. Replacing the old playground equipment is still the first priority come spring. The children use this equipment year around. They and the moms will be very pleased.

Megan reported that all the locations for the new equipment were marked by Public Works Mgr., Jake and his crew this past January before the big snows. The new equipment has been priced and ordered. Once the playground equipment is installed, the Exercise/fitness station and the Canoe/kayak pier on Cedar Creek are next on the list followed by the cement or stone patio next to the pavilion. Jake is looking at early summer to start on this project. The three park benches will be placed along the walking trails and the two metal picnic tables near Cedar Creek. I am pleased to report that we are at 45% of our \$5,000.00, ten-year goal for new trees planted in the park and flowering shrubs in our four flower beds. This will be a special year as the new park equipment is installed. Stay tuned for more updates as we move into spring.
