# Local Lions Nearing 10<sup>th</sup> Anniversary of Transporting Corneal Tissue

In March the Grafton Lions along with the help of several Cedarburg Lions will celebrate 10 years of transporting eye tissue to the Lions Eye Bank of Wisconsin (LEBW) and to local hospitals. Wisconsin has near 550 Lions Clubs and nearly half of them have transport groups. These transport groups, nick named the "Cornea Express" handle hundreds of transports throughout the State of Wisconsin each year. While there are a number of Eye Banks in the United States, Wisconsin is the only state that works with Lions to provide a completely volunteer group. This volunteer service saves the LEBW over \$300,000 annually, money which can be used for research, equipment and ultimately a higher level of service to the recipients of our work.

The Eye Bank first began in 1953 in Milwaukee and was sponsored by Marquette University Medical School. In 1964 this Milwaukee Eye Bank was taken over bye the Wisconsin Lions Foundation (WLF) and was renamed the Wisconsin Lions Eye Bank. In 1969 a separate eye bank facility in Madison was started with the same goals to the Milwaukee program. This program was administered by UW Madison and University Hospitals and Clinics.

In 1969 the two programs joined forces and united in a merger and in 2000 the name was changed to the Lions Eye Bank of Wisconsin (LEBW).

Our local "Cornea Express" has been doing transports nearly 10 years now, one year we do May and the alternate year we do March and November. Over the 10 years our group has averaged just under 10 trips in the 10- day period. Our Lions have handled over 140 transports, delivering over 150 tissue containers. We have logged over 600 service hours and logged near 20,000 miles while providing this service. This year we have been asked to take over an additional time slot so starting August 1<sup>st</sup> we will be handling the first half of August. Just yesterday I took an emergency call asking for help to do a tissue transport to the both Wisconsin Diagnostics Laboratories, formerly Dynacare, and to St. Luke's Transplant Center. Lion Mercer was gracious enough to step forward. I must believe this is a testament to the level of the service our team provides.

Ten years of service to a single project is, I feel, is a milestone for our club and needs to be brought out to all members of our club. A level of thanks goes out to all our transporters so the next time you see a Lion wearing his vest with an Eye Bank Patch on it say thanks for your service.
