Treasurer's Report January 1, 2021

Administrative Account:

We received \$150 in dues from one member for last year, current year, and next year's dues.

We paid \$55 for stamps and \$7.17 To LCI for member dues.

Activity Account:

We made \$2,031.70 after expenses on the nut sale this year compared to budgets amount of \$1,050. This compares to \$1,186.90 for last year's nut sale.

We made \$10,795.71 on the golf outing compared to budgeted amount of \$6,000. This compares to \$8,642.30 the previous year.

We received a generous donation of \$200 from Dave Burkhardt.

GRAFTON LIONS PARK – UPDATES & CHANGES

REMOVAL OF DAMAGED PLAYGROUND EQUIPMENT AND NEW EQUIPMENT

True to her word, Grafton Parks and Rec. Director, Megan Phalin, has removed the damaged Playground Equipment at the end of November. With 70 % of the equipment in disrepair, not much is left. See Photos.

New equipment has been ordered and will be delivered as winter turns to spring. Installing this new state of the art playground equipment has been given first priority as soon as the Village crews can get on the grounds and start the project. We expect late spring, maybe June for completion. This will be just in time for the kids to get outdoors and try out every piece.

Sometime in May, expect to see more park benches along the walking trails and two more metal picnic tables near Cedar Creek. In the meantime, the Exercise/Fitness Station, Canoe/Kayak Pier will have been ordered. Weather permitting, a cement/stone patio, capable of handling a tent and doubling the size of the pavilion, will be installed. This additional covered space is sorely needed to protect more guests against rain and hot sun.

As we move into July, the city crews will have taken care of most of the other park projects throughout the Village. We expect the fitness station and kayak pier to be next on the list.

Hopefully, we will get a handle on the Covid-19 pandemic and things can move along. Hopefully, the vaccine will make it possible for all of us to socialize and get back to some sense of normality.

Hopefully, we will be able to celebrate the Grafton Lions Club 60th anniversary this coming summer.
